We would like to thank Revd. Hamilton for his continued support and for leading such thoughtful and meaningful services in our Visitor Café.

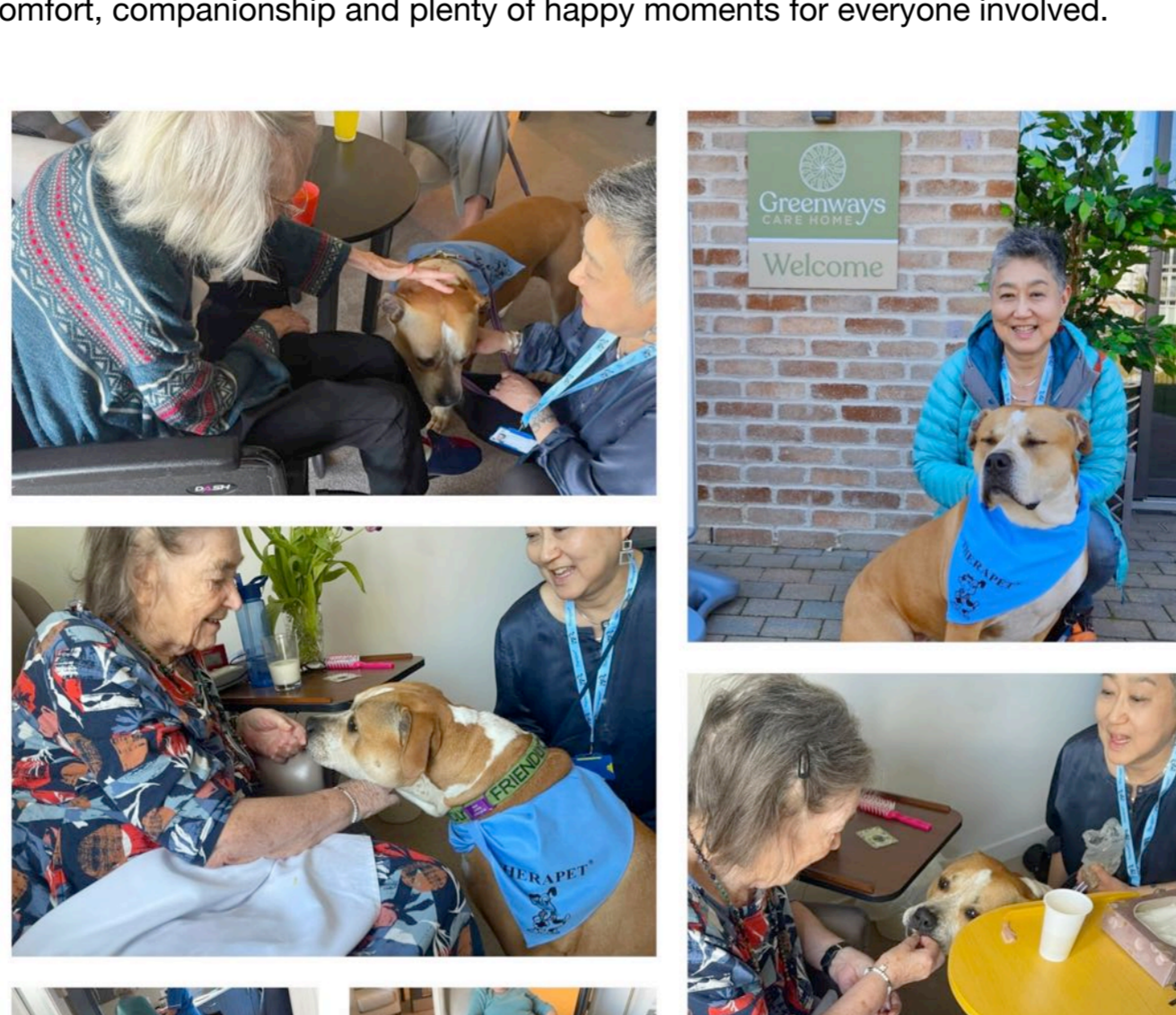


### A Visit from Shiv the Therapet
